

Snake River Sockeye Run Summary

July 21, 2026

Return to the Stanley basin:

25 PIT tagged SR sockeye over Bonneville

The last one crossed on July 11

One SR sockeye PIT tag detected at Priest Rapids Dam

One sockeye detected at the USE array near Challis

Conversion has declined sharply

17 (of 25) PIT tagged sockeye are over Lower Granite

2 run-at-large sockeye tagged at Bonneville (BONAFF) have crossed Lower Granite

15 of 16 (93.8%) passing BON on or before June 28 survived to Lower Granite

5 of 11 (45.5%) passing BON after June 28 survived to Lower Granite

The late group contains both BONAFF tagged fish

Temperature of Snake River near Anatone; ~21 C — warm, but probably passable.

Temperature of Salmon River at White Bird, ID: 22.5-24 C — requires the fish find thermal refugia

Sockeye Trap and haul:

Began trap and haul from Lower Granite on 6/29

Week 1 – 4 fish

Week 2 – 16 fish (*correction from last week

Week 3 – 14 fish

Mortality = 2 fish

Total on hand = 32 fish

Sockeye Return to Bonneville Hatchery:

To date 771 program sockeye have been trapped

Seven un-marked sockeye have been trapped and released upstream of Bonneville Dam

Sockeye Transfers to Eagle Hatchery from Bonneville Hatchery

On July 2, 151 sockeye were transferred from Bonneville Hatchery to Eagle Hatchery
On July 9, 255 sockeye were transferred from Bonneville Hatchery to Eagle Hatchery
On July 16, 281 sockeye were transferred from Bonneville Hatchery to Eagle Hatchery
On July 23, 86 sockeye will be transferred from Bonneville Hatchery to Eagle Hatchery

Sockeye Releases from Bonneville Hatchery Collections

To date 685 sockeye have been released into Redfish and Pettit lakes

511 to Redfish Lake (243 Female, 268 Male)

173 to Pettit Lake (86 Female, 87 Male)
